December 2024

Streets

- The ram for the rear stabilizer for the backhoe has been repaired and installed. Several hydraulic leaks have been found and dealt with.
- Jason's sander has been repaired. We had to replace several bearings and do some work on the auger chain. He said it works better than last year.
- Jason has been handling a lot of the plowing on his own. Several things have come up in discussion and have been brought to his attention during de-briefing. Overall, he's doing a good job.

Water

- The plant is running great.
- Mark and I were able to run the well for several days, off the village feed, do dial in our chlorine feed. I ordered, and received an orthophosphate test kit to test for phosphate and help dial in the sequestering agent we have for iron control in the well. I have the literature and formulas to do the calculations for dosing. We must still get back down there and run the well for that.
- We have gone through the list of "trouble" meters and have found several issues ranging from bookkeeping to bad remotes, or wires. The process is still ongoing but making headway.
- We are down to 2 meters. I had to order another case of ten to keep going on our work. That will help with the cost when we decide on the meter upgrade.

Sewer

- The plant is running great. Our percent removal for BOD is 99.5, and for TSS is 99.2
- We have got our solids inventory back down to below average numbers. I have started accepting septic haulers again, starting with Freds.
- On December 3rd, we had a meeting at Lamont engineers with the mayor, Bobby Hyatt, Jeff Haslun, Mark Temp, and Brendon from Lamonts about the upcoming Warnerville sewer project. We just went over some responsibilities of everyone and what's expected moving forward.
